“Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia! The Lord of life is risen today!” Our joy at Christ’s triumph over death is reflected in the victorious nature of both the text and the music in this triumphant Easter hymn of praise. Penned by Cyril A. Alington (1872-1955) the hymn was written especially for this rousing tune (*Gelobt Sei Gott*—praise to God). The triumphal “alleluias” may ring in your ears long after this morning’s service. Alington, an Anglican priest, head master of Eton College, Dean of Durham Cathedral and onetime chaplain to King George, wrote other poetry, theological books, essays and novels. This hymn, which may be his most well known, appears in both our Green Hymnal (p. 307) and our Blue Hymnal (p. 111).

The tune, composed by Melchior Vulpius, was found originally in *Ein schön geistlich Gesangbuch* (1609). Vulpius is considered the leading composer of hymn tunes between Martin Luther (1483-1546) and Johann Crüger (1598-1662). From 1596 to his death in 1615, he was a teacher at the Latin school and municipal cantor at Weimar. He composed nearly two hundred motets and over four hundred hymns along with his other works, all written for Lutheran worship.

The Sanctuary Choir begins the service singing “Since by Man Came Death” from *Messiah* and closes the service with its traditional singing of the *Hallelujah Chorus*. Often sung at Christmas, the *Hallelujah Chorus* is actually the final piece in the Easter section of Handel’s *Messiah*.
