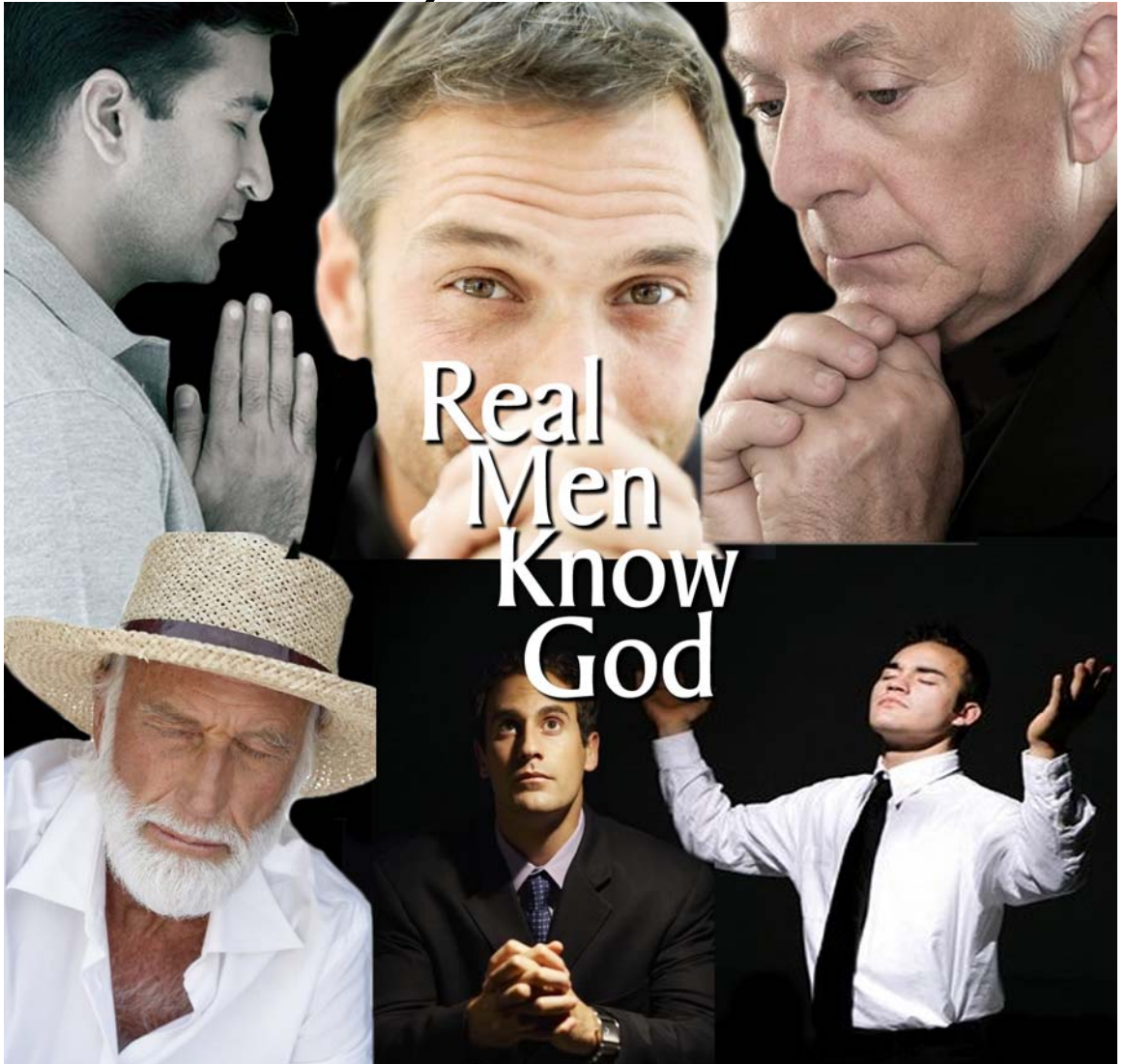

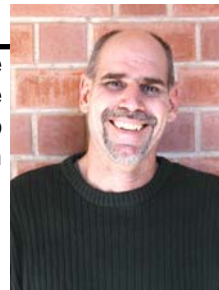

WORSHIP & WONDER: CHURCH FOR KIDS!

After the children's message, leaders escort children to CE Room 7. Parents may pick up their children in CE Room 7 after the worship service.

DRAW US IN THE SPIRIT'S TETHER*HAROLD FRIEDEL (1905-1958)*

*Draw us in the Spirit's tether;
 For when humbly, in thy name,
 Two or three are met together,
 Thou art in the midst of them:
 Alleluya! Alleluya! Touch we now thy garment's hem.*

*As the faithful used to gather
 In the name of Christ to sup,
 Then with thanks to God the Father
 Break the bread and bless the cup,
 Alleluya! Alleluya! So knit thou our friendship up.*

*All our meals and all our living
 Make as sacraments of thee,
 That by caring, helping, giving,
 We may true disciples be.
 Alleluya! Alleluya! We will serve thee faithfully.*

The text of this morning's anthem is based on Matthew 18:20: "For where two or three are gathered together in My name, there am I in the midst of them." It was written by Percy Dearmer in 1931 as three additional stanzas to another hymn entitled *Lord Enthroned in Heavenly Splendor*. These three focus on our Christian community as we share the bread and cup of the Lord's table.

Percy Dearmer, clergyman and poet (1867-1936), was educated at Oxford, served several churches, was a vicar in London and also served as chaplain to the British Red Cross in Serbia in World War I. He was later appointed professor of ecclesiastical art at King's College, London, where he remained until his death. He served as a hymnal editor with Ralph Vaughn Williams and Martin Shaw.

The text is coupled with composer Harold Friedell's tune, *Union Seminary*, a hymn tune written in 1957 specifically for this text and named by Friedell after his alma mater. Friedell, who was born in Jamaica, Long Island, New York, studied at the Julliard School of Music and Union Theological Seminary. He later taught at Julliard and at Union Seminary School of Music as well as at the Guilmant Organ School, also in New York City. He served as organist at Calvary Church (1934-1946) and then as organist at St. Bartholomew's (both in New York City) until his death in 1958. The text, coupled with Friedell's tune, has found its way into many modern hymnals and can be found on page 504 of the *Presbyterian Hymnal*.

The poetry presents a vehicle for a prayer and communion meditation on the discipleship of one's faith. Perhaps there is no humbler prayer than that our lives be as a sacrament - that our actions be efficacious signs of grace, that our faith bear fruit in those who meet and interact with us, that our lives be caring, helping, giving in such ways that we lead others to new life in Christ.
