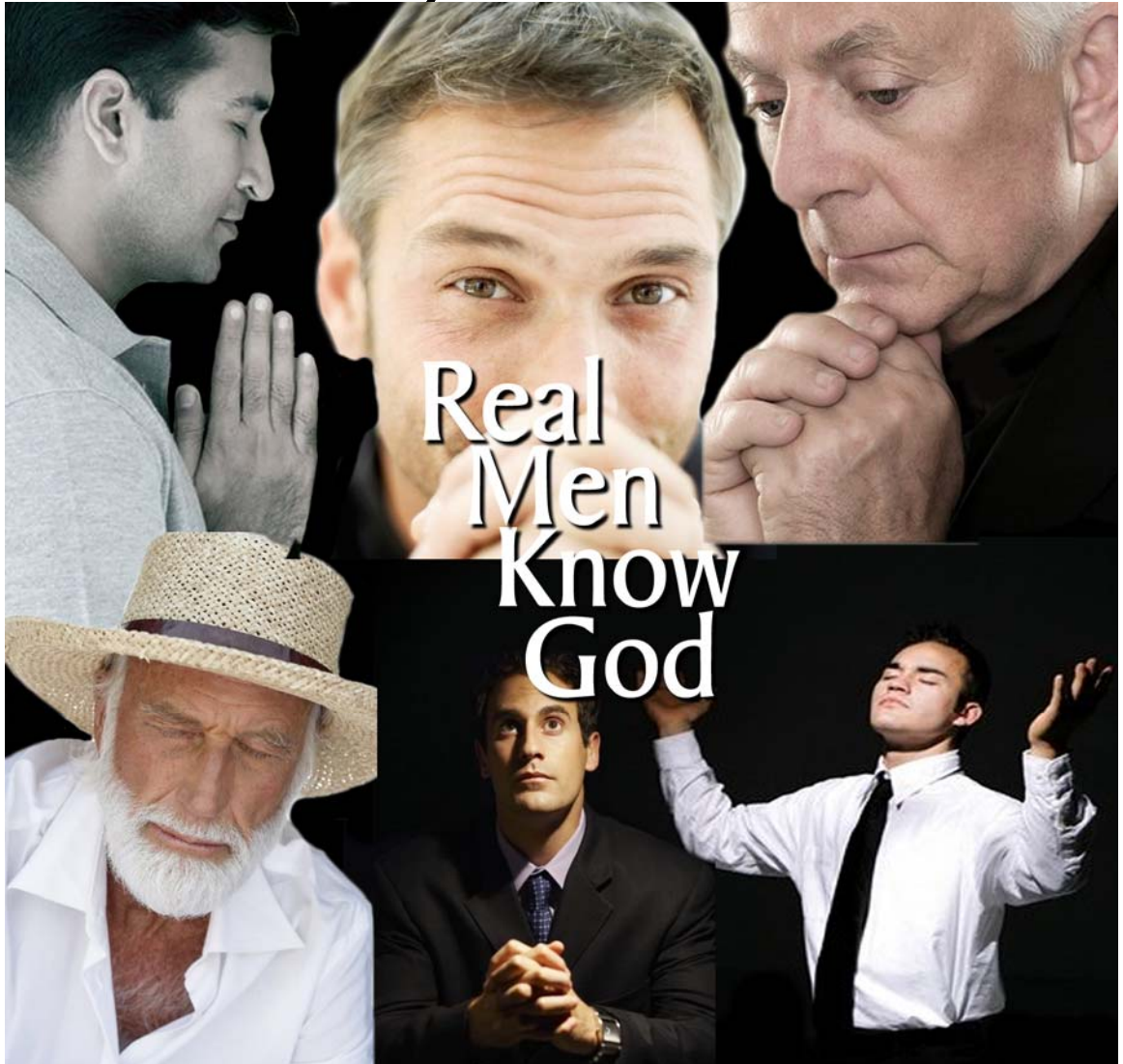

THE MUSIC OF THY NAME

CRAIG COURTNEY (B. 1955)

*Jesus, my Shepherd, Guide and Friend,
My Prophet, Priest and King;
My Lord, my Life, my Way, my End,
Accept the praise I bring.
Alleluia.*

*Weak is the effort of my heart,
And cold my warmest thought;
But when I see Thee as Thou art,
I'll praise Thee as I ought.
Alleluia.*

*'Till then I would thy love proclaim
with every fleeting breath;
And may the music of Thy name
Refresh my soul in death.
Alleluia. Amen.*

This morning's anthem combines a text by John Newton (1725-1807), the well-known English hymnwriter, former slave trader and sea captain who wrote *Amazing Grace*, and the contemporary composer, Craig Courtney, also well known for his sensitive underscoring of hymn and anthem texts.

Newton's life is a example of salvation. He was the self-proclaimed wretch who once was lost but then was found, saved by God's amazing grace.

Newton, born in London, was the son of a commander in the merchant service. His mother died of consumption when he was seven years old. When he was eleven, he went to sea with his father and made six voyages with him before 1742. After returning from a voyage to Venice about 1743, he joined another ship with a brutal captain and soon deserted. When recaptured he was degraded, flogged and exchanged to a slaver.

Newton grew into a godless and abandoned man and for a period of 15 months lived, half starved and ill treated, as a slave in Africa. A chance reading of Thomas à Kempis sowed the seed of his conversion. It was accelerated by a night spent steering a slave ship in a dreadful storm in the face of apparent death. As long as he lived, he kept the anniversary of his conversion, March 1748, as a day of humiliation and thanksgiving for his "great deliverance." He eventually left the sea, educated himself, became ordained and wrote some hundreds of hymns, such as that being sung this morning.

Newton composed the inscription which appears on his grave:

JOHN NEWTON, CLERK,
ONCE AN INFIDEL AND LIBERTINE,
A SERVANT OF SLAVES IN AFRICA; WAS
BY THE RICH MERCY OF OUR LORD AND SAVIOUR JESUS CHRIST,
PRESERVED, RESTORED, PARDONED,
AND APPOINTED TO PREACH THE FAITH
HE HAD LONG LABOURED TO DESTROY.
NEAR SIXTEEN YEARS AT OLNEY IN BUCKS,
AND TWENTY-SEVEN YEARS IN THIS CHURCH.
