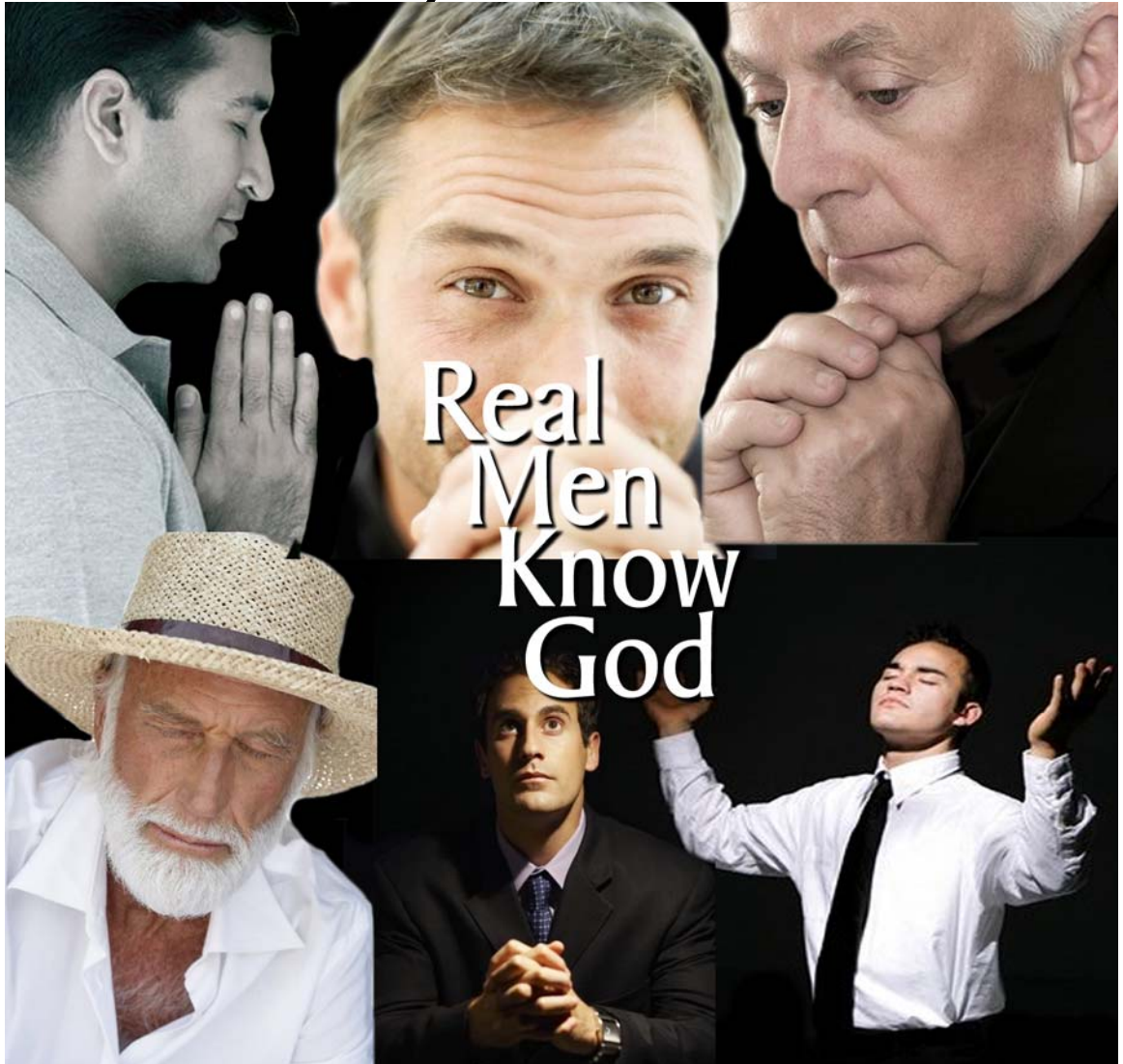

After the children's message, leaders escort children to CE Room 7. Any parent of a new or visiting child is welcome to go with their child to Worship and Wonder until they feel that their child is comfortable. Parents may pick up their children in CE Room 7 after the worship service.

On this Father's Day, the choir is singing a musical text that is honoring of our fathers—and our mothers. The text is based on the fifth of the Ten Commandments and is taken from the Scripture found in Deuteronomy 5:16: "Honor your father and your mother, as the Lord your God has commanded you, that your days may be long, and that it may be well with you." The Ten Commandments were given directly by God on tablets of stone to the people of Israel at Mount Sinai after he had delivered them from slavery in Egypt. These commandments have become the moral underpinnings of Christian behavior.

In creating the anthem text, composer Joseph Martin expands and expounds on the commandment by identifying ways that we may honor our mothers and our fathers, such as treating them with kindness, caring and respect, recognizing and being thankful for all they have done for us. It is interesting to note that the commandment has a promise attached. "...that your days may be long and that it may be well with you." God is making clear the value and importance demonstrating love and respect in our families by honoring our parents.

Both the text and the music were composed by the prolific composer, Joseph Martin. Recognized throughout the United States for his many choral compositions, both sacred and secular, he has over a thousand compositions currently in print. Several of his works are staples in our choir's repertoire.
