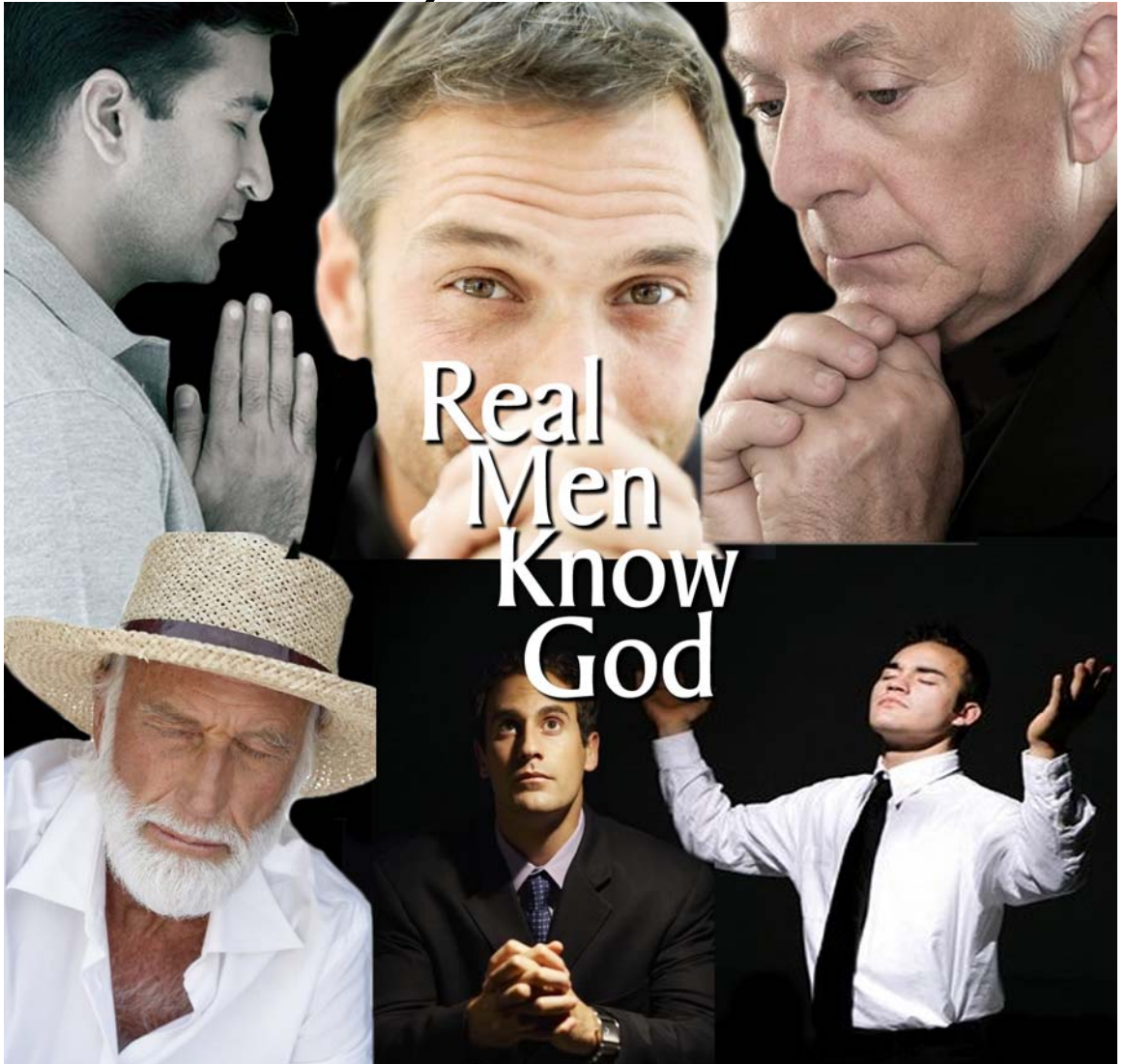

*TEACH ME, O JEHOVAH**CARL O. BORGESON (1909-1988)*

*Teach me, O Jehovah, the way of thy statutes
and I shall keep it unto the end.*

*Give me understanding and I shall keep thy law,
yea, I will observe it with my whole heart.*

This morning's anthem, *Teach Me, O Jehovah*, is based on Psalm 119:33-40. This Old Testament text is a call for us to seek God's guidance and understanding for our lives, not just knowing the words of the statutes, but also knowing the way of applying them to ourselves. Incidentally, Psalm 119 is the longest Psalm in the Bible; it is also the longest chapter, having 176 verses.

Composed by Carl O. Borgeson, this anthem was the second in his series of anthems based on Scripture. It was composed in 1945. Carl Borgeson was born in 1909 to immigrant Scandinavian parents in Manistee, Michigan. His father was active in church music and Carl started his musical studies at the Bush Conservatory of Music in Chicago. His studies were cut short by the Great Depression and many years later he resumed his composition studies at Michigan State University.

Mr. Borgeson taught public school band and choir and followed after his father, who was choir director at the Evangelical Covenant Church in Muskegon, Michigan, for 25 years. Carl held this post for 45 years!

He composed music for all the musical groups he directed—school and church—as well as composing in response to commissions by other high school bands and choir directors. He served many years as a judge in various music competitions. In addition to being an orchestral clarinet player, he played both the clarinet and saxophone in the service of sacred music in his church and in other churches as well.

After his retirement, Carl and his wife served as short-term missionaries in the Congo, where he taught music and history to missionary students. He also traveled with local missionaries, playing his saxophone.

This morning the anthem is being directed by James Borgeson, Carl's son. Jim studied composition at the University of Arizona and taught music in public schools, and was Director of the School of Music, University of Hermosillo. Jim sings tenor in our choir and has also filled in as director when needed. This morning, however, he has been asked specifically to direct the anthem composed by his father. Thank you, Jim.

SUMMER BIBLE BLAST

Focusing on the Lord's Prayer, this session children are learning through storytelling, cooking, video and art. Bible BLAST is open to children three years old by (August 31) through fifth grade.
