

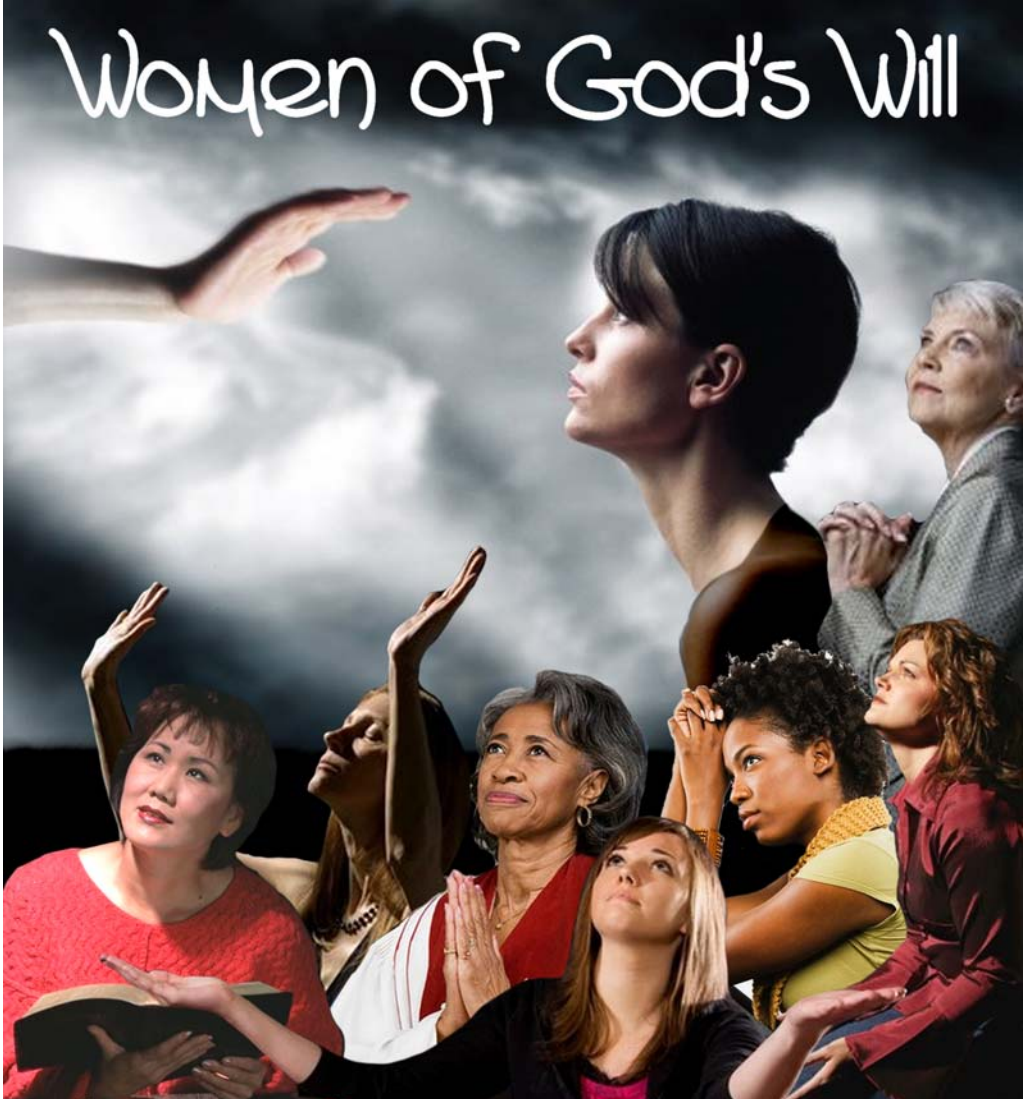

*God Bless America,

This Independence Day weekend, the Summer Choir is singing Irving Berlin's timeless prayer for America, *God Bless America*. This inspiring and popular patriotic song has a very interesting history. It was originally composed in 1918 while Irving Berlin was serving in the United States Army and it was intended for an Army revue. However, it was set aside and not used.

Berlin, who was born Israel Baline and who was a Jewish immigrant from Siberia, revived the song as a "peace song" in 1938 with the rise of Hitler. It was introduced to the American public on an Armistice Day broadcast in 1938 and was sung by Kate Smith. The song was an immediate hit; there was even a movement to make it the national anthem of the United States. In a selfless act of patriotism, Berlin gave the royalties of the song to the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and Campfire Girls.

Berlin was one of eight children. His father, Moses, was a cantor but had to supplement his income by working in a market as a *schochet* (one who kills kosher animals as prescribed by Jewish religious laws). His family moved to New York in 1893 to escape the pogroms in Russia. At the age of eight, he took to the streets of the Lower East Side of New York City to help support his mother and family after his father died. In the early 1900s, he worked as a singing waiter in many restaurants and started writing songs.

Berlin became a prolific song writer, composing more than 900 songs, 19 musicals and the scores of 18 movies. Some of his most famous are *White Christmas*, *Easter Parade*, and *There's No Business Like Show Business*. With memorable and singable melodies, unbridled emotion and timeless lyrics, his songs have had an indelible stamp on American popular music. This rousing arrangement for choir was created by Roy Ringwald (1910-1995) and copyrighted in 1939. Ringwald created hundreds of stirring choral arrangements including what is probably his most well known: *The Battle Hymn of the Republic*. It is good that we pray verbally and musically for God's continued blessing on America on this Independence Day.

Welcome to Rose Perrill, soprano, who is singing *America, the Beautiful* at the 9:30am worship service, a hymn most people learned as school children. The poetry was written in 1893 by a "Woman of God's Will," Katherine Bates (1859-1929), professor of English literature at Wellesley College. Two events in her life in the summer of 1893 precipitated the writing of this hymn: Traveling from New England and visiting the Columbian Exposition in Chicago (with its White City—hence, "alabaster cities gleam") which stirred feelings of patriotism within her and traveling across the Great Plains, eventually ascending Pikes Peak. Her soul was again stirred at the majesty and enormity of God's creation. She wrote that "It was there as I was looking out over the amber skies, that the opening lines of this text formed themselves in my mind."

SUMMER BIBLE BLAST

Focusing on the Lord's Prayer, this session children are learning through storytelling, cooking, video and art. Bible BLAST is open to children three years old by (August 31) through fifth grade. Children having just completed preschool or kindergarten meet in Room 5 and grades 1-5 meet in Rooms 8/9. Children will be promoted to their next grade level on Promotion Sunday, August 16.
