

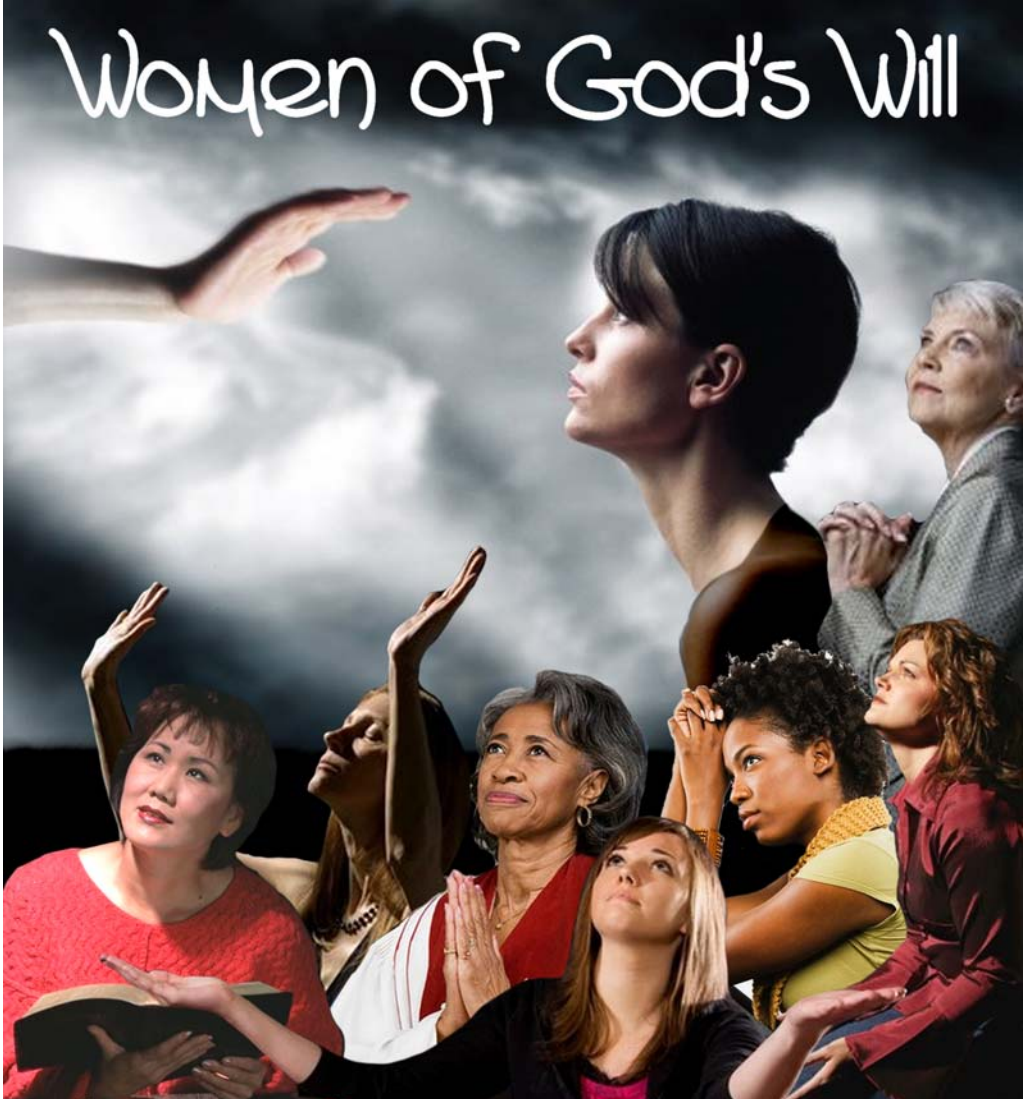

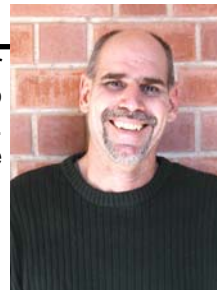

**THE GRACE DIVINE**

RESIGNATION ARR. ROGER PRICE

*Come, let us use the grace divine, and all with one accord,  
in a perpetual covenant join ourselves to Christ the Lord;  
Give up ourselves, thru Jesus' power, his name to glorify;  
and promise, in this sacred hour, for God to live and die.*

*The covenant we this moment make be ever kept in mind;  
we will no more our God forsake, or cast these words behind.  
We never will throw off the fear of God who hears our vow;  
and if thou art well pleased to hear, come down and meet us now.*

*Thee, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, let all our hearts receive,  
present with thy celestial host the peaceful answer give;  
to each covenant the blood apply which takes our sins away,  
and register our names on high and keep us to that day!*

Charles Wesley (1762) wrote the text of *The Grace Divine* and based it on Jeremiah 50:5: *They will ask for the way to Zion, turning their faces in its direction; they will come that they may join themselves to the LORD in an everlasting covenant that will not be forgotten.*

Charles Wesley (1707-1788) was one of the most prolific English-speaking hymn writers, having composed more than 6,500 hymns. His conversion experience released within him his gift of song. On the very day after his conversion, he wrote his first hymn, *Where Shall My Wondering Soul Begin*. Certainly an apt question regarding his changed life. After that, hardly a day or experience passed without its crystallization into verse. He composed in his study, his garden, on horseback—anywhere. His hymns reflect every conceivable phase of Christian experience and Methodist theology. He believed he had been saved for a special mission and that he ought to diligently work to fulfill his obligation to God.

While attending Oxford University in 1728, Charles and his brother, John, the founder of Methodism, were ordained as priests of the Church of England, and they faithfully kept their holy orders throughout their lives.

**Arlyn Peterson**, long-time former Sanctuary Choir member and director from 1963-65, parts of 1974-75 and 1976-1977, passed away on June 30, 2009. In addition to his years as director, Arlyn sang faithfully in the choir for over 20 years. He was a superb baritone soloist, a mentor and voice teacher to other soloists, a public school teacher and Dusty Johnson's immediate predecessor. He and his wife, Pat, moved to Sun City, Arizona, several years ago to be near their son, Eric, who is also a school teacher. Arlyn never forgot the Northminster Choir and kept in touch with some of the "old timers." Although his death is a great loss to those who knew and loved him, there is surely rejoicing in heaven as he now sings praises in the heavenly choir with those family and friends who have preceded him.

*JOHNSTON FEED THE HUNGRY PROGRAM*

The first part of the *Feed the Hungry* program started on June 27 with 11 boxes for Cragin Elementary School families. Sign up for this new NPC program in the Church Office. We have broken down the duties into three areas and are scheduling for the July and August distribution on the last Saturday of the month. The volunteer opportunities are for shoppers (people who like to get the best deals from the grocery ads). We will need people to pack the boxes and distribute them to the families as they come to pick them up. This would be about two hours on a Saturday morning. The third area would be to deliver the food box if the family could not pick it up. All the families from Cragin were able to pick up their own box (one even walked to get it). We thank all the volunteers who worked on this first distribution.

We used cardboard boxes for the distribution and we asked each family to return it so it could be used again. This will work for awhile but we know down the road we will need to get something a bit more sturdy. If you have milk crates, bins, storage boxes or plastic containers that could hold groceries please consider donating them to the church if you don't need them.

We are anxious to start the next leg of this program, which is to continue this is for any of our members or preschool who might need assistance with food. We will need a volunteer coordinator to lead this next team and we hope to find the person that has the gifts God has given of feeding the hungry. The format and grocery list has been created so it would entail enlisting volunteers to help with the three areas listed above.
