

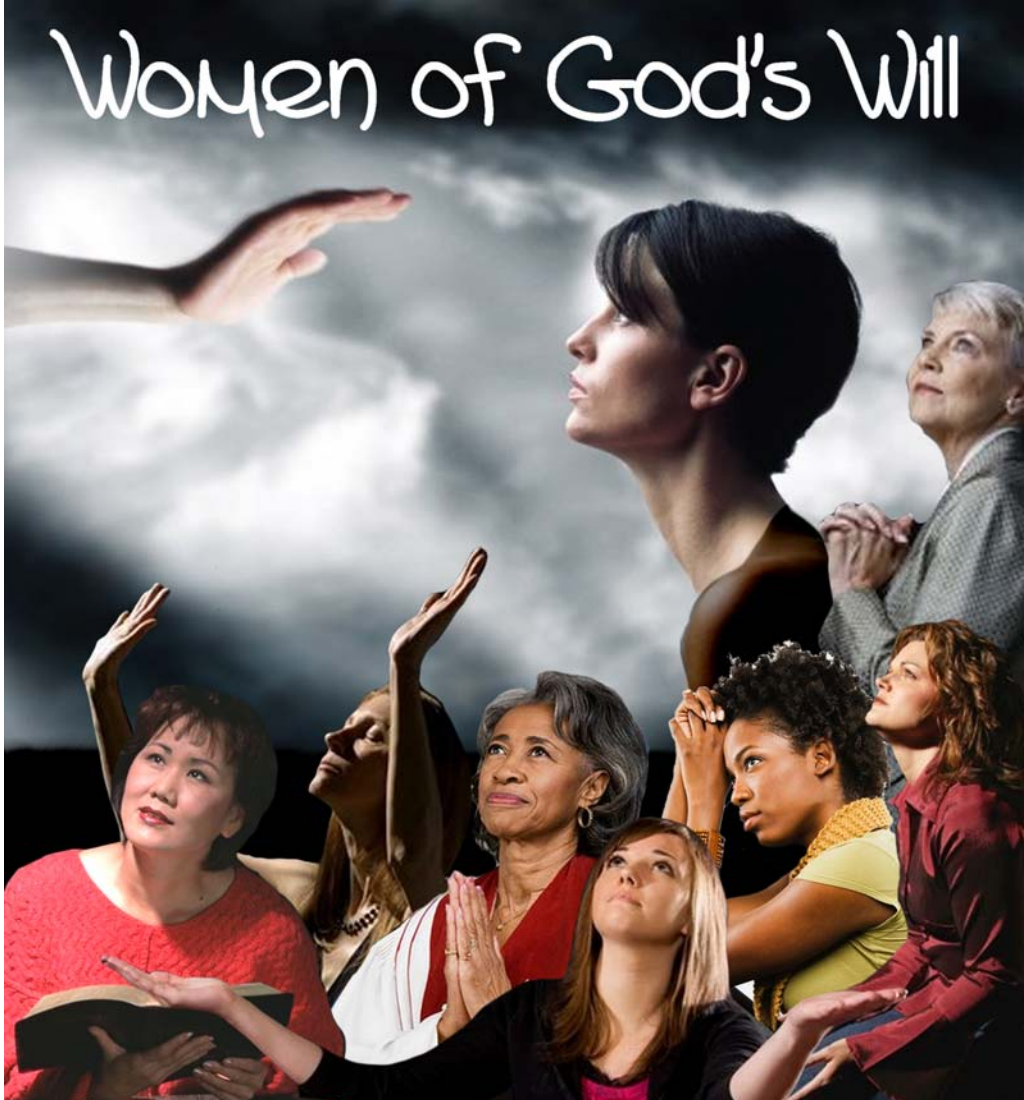

It is designed to help children experience God through music, biblical storytelling, and prayer while giving children the freedom to respond to God (wonder) in their own way. After the children's message, leaders escort children to CE Room 7. Any parent of a new or visiting child is welcome to go with their child to Worship and Wonder until they feel that their child is comfortable. Parents may pick up their children in CE Room 7 after the worship service.

LEAD ME LORD, IN THY RIGHTEOUSNESS SAMUEL SEBASTIAN WESLEY (1810-1876)

*Lead me, Lord,
lead me in thy righteousness;
make thy way plain before my face.
For it is thou, Lord, thou, Lord only,
that makest me dwell in safety.*

This very quiet anthem of prayerful devotion is based on Psalms 5:8, 4:8 with the text and music composed by Samuel S. Wesley, son of the composer Samuel Wesley and the grandson of the hymnist, Charles Wesley (who wrote the text of last week's anthem).

Samuel Sebastian Wesley was born in London. After singing in the choir of the Chapel Royal as a boy, he embarked on a career as a musician, becoming organist of Hereford Cathedral in 1821 (where he eloped with the Dean's daughter). He moved to Exeter Cathedral three years later, and subsequently held appointments at Leeds Parish Church, Winchester Cathedral and Gloucester Cathedral. Famous as an organist in his day, he composed almost exclusively for the Church of England. His more well known anthems include *Thou Wilt Keep Him in Perfect Peace* and *Wash Me Thoroughly*, both of which are in the Northminster Choral Library. This morning's anthem *Lead Me Lord* is an extract from a larger work entitled *Praise the Lord, O My Soul*.

Music and living faith are hallmarks of this famous family, which includes John Wesley, the founder of Methodism. This short anthem is a classic, a standard learned by virtually all choirs. It is also a "little" hymn of prayer to calm our souls when we are in the midst of problems, especially with those who might desire to hurt us. Read the verse: "Lead me, O Lord, in your righteousness because of my enemies—make straight your way before me." (New International Version). Perhaps this prayer is particularly meaningful today.

JOHNSTON FEED THE HUNGRY PROGRAM

The first part of the *Feed the Hungry* program started on June 27 with 11 boxes for Cragin Elementary School families. Sign up for this new NPC program in the Church Office. We have broken down the duties into three areas and are scheduling for the July and August distribution on the last Saturday of the month. The volunteer opportunities are for shoppers (people who like to get the best deals from the grocery ads). We will need people to pack the boxes and distribute them to the families as they come to pick them up. This would be about two hours on a Saturday morning. The third area would be to deliver the food box if the family could not pick it up. All the families from Cragin were able to pick up their own box (one even walked to get it). We thank all the volunteers who worked on this first distribution.

We used cardboard boxes for the distribution and we asked each family to return it so it could be used again. This will work for awhile but we know down the road we will need to get something a bit more sturdy. If you have bins, storage boxes or plastic containers that could hold groceries please consider donating them to the church if you don't need them.

We are anxious to start the next leg of this program, which is to continue it for any of our members or preschool who might need assistance with food. We will need a volunteer coordinator to lead this next team and we hope to find the person that has the gifts God has given of feeding the hungry. The format and grocery list has been created so it would entail enlisting volunteers to help with the three areas listed above.
