It is designed to help children experience God through music, biblical storytelling, and prayer while giving children the freedom to respond to God (wonder) in their own way. After the children's message, leaders escort children to CE Room 7. Any parent of a new or visiting child is welcome to go with their child to Worship and Wonder until they feel that their child is comfortable. Parents may pick up their children in CE Room 7 after the worship service.

*Loving savior, precious Savior, I know you are mine.
Lead me ever, walk beside me, may my heart to you incline,
Loving Savior divine.*

This simple, prayerful text is set to a simple, engaging melody, based on a traditional Early American round. It is written in only two parts, divided between men and women. The anthem is marked *cantabile* (flowing, melodious). As you listen, note that the gentle accompaniment underscores the simplicity of the vocal lines, all of which underscores the prayerful, yet joyfully positive, nature of the text.

This text from 1 John 4:9-10 seems a perfect match for the anthem text: "This is how God showed his love among us: he sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

Douglas Wagner, composer, is internationally recognized as both composer and arranger. He was a high school music educator and administrator for thirty years, but now devotes himself to composition. He has served many denominations as a church musician.

More than 1,600 titles of music by Mr. Wagner have been published since 1973, including works for choir (sacred and secular), concert band, orchestra, handbell ensemble, organ, piano, and voice. Well over twelve million copies of his music have been sold to date.

Solo: Give Me Jesus

This almost otherworldly song is an African-American spiritual which has its roots in slavery. It, along with other spirituals, grew directly out of the experiences of American slaves as they worked and sought relief from their bondage through singing by expressing their joys, pains, and hope for ultimate redemption. Singing was often also a method of communication relating to escapes to freedom in the North. Spirituals such as *Wade in the Water, The Gospel Train, and Swing Low, Sweet Chariot* might refer directly to the Underground Railroad.

Julia Higgins has been attending Northminster Presbyterian Church for the past seven years and currently serves on staff as the Director of Contemporary Music for the 8:00am and Fusion worship services. Julia teaches choir at Esperero Canyon Middle School, sings professionally with the Tucson Chamber Artists and is the President-Elect of the Choral Directors of Arizona.
