"Billy," as he is known, has been at Immanuel for a number of years and brings a wealth of sacred music expertise and experience to his practice of sacred music. Although his works have been available through various church music publishers since 1978, in recent years he created his own online publishing business: *Church Music on Demand* which makes his music available—and downloadable—through the internet. Billy is known and respected as a church music clinician in various areas, particularly in writing and arranging for choir and instrumental combinations.

Praise You Lord, O My Soul will be sung by the combined Presbyterian choirs at the Presbyterian Music Festival on January 22 and will be conducted by Dr. Schurr.
